I have spoken a number of times in my Encompass article about the chartering of Formations, and yes, it is once again the subject of my article this month, except that it is to advise you of some changes in relation to chartering, so I would suggest that you read on rather than turning the page.

As a result of discussions with the Region Commissioners, Sectional Branch Commissioners and Deputy Chief Commissioners, we have decided to make some changes in the chartering system. Chartering will still be tied into the 2020 Plan and will now be compulsory for all Formations within the Queensland Branch.

The charter/recharter document has been revamped and now contains two sections. The first section has to be completed on an annual basis or when the Formation first becomes chartered. The second part will need to be completed by chartered Formations on a bi-annual basis. The first part contains a number of items which are all required to be completed. It's not like when you go and buy a car and choose the optional extras you want, these items really cover how the parents attached to the Formation would expect that Formation to perform in light of the Association's policies. The second part gives some options as to the number of items to be completed, which will allow some flexibility as far as a Formation is concerned.

The other thing that has been changed is that we will now have a common month for the chartering/rechartering of Formations and that will be during the month of October each year.

In the past it has been up to the Formation Leader to contact their Team Leader when they believe they are ready to be chartered. This will no longer be the case as it is now the responsibility of the Region Commissioner to arrange for this interview to be carried out. In some cases the Region Commissioner will delegate this responsibility to the District Commissioner or one of the Assistant Region Commissioners. The person doing the interview has the option of recommending that the Group be chartered/rechartered or may recommend that the Group is not ready to be chartered at that time.

Region Commissioners will be responsible for the charter interview with District Commissioners in relation to District chartering. The Chief Commissioner or his nominee will be responsible for the chartering of the various sections of the Branch.

Irrespective of when a Formation is chartered, they will be required to recharter in October this year.

If the Formation is not ready to be chartered at that stage, it is anticipated that the person doing the interview will work through with the Formation Leader the items which still need to be attended to with the view of making sure that that Formation is assisted to complete these items by no later than 31 December each year.

There should be no reason why every Formation within the Queensland Branch cannot meet the chartering criteria. These

criteria are after all nothing more than the responsibilities that Formations are expected to meet in ensuring that the Formation not only meets its statutory requirements, but also creates an atmosphere which enhances the learning and the development of the young people entrusted into our care by their parents.

The fact that the charter certificate is hanging on the wall of the Formation's meeting place is a clear indication to all who enter that meeting place that the Formation is performing to the expectation of the parents, Adult Supporters, Leaders and the Formation's Executive Committee.

We have a number of Formations throughout the Queensland Branch who have been chartered since its inception. The challenge for us this year is to get every Formation within the Queensland Branch chartered.

What makes a good Leader?

Having recently returned from a fantastic Cub Scout Expo (Cub Scout Leaders Safari) in Far North Region with Alan Fleming (Region Advisor Near North Coast and Country) assisting me, I am totally inspired and enthused about 2011.

On the plane home as Al and I chatted about the event we picked up the Virgin Magazine and there was an article about leadership. We related it to our Leadership base and there are a few points that got me thinking about sharing with you in *Encompass*. As I know we all want to 'do our best' and worry when other commitments stop us from achieving what we would like. Here are some tips thanks to Bina Brown (*Virgin Blue Voyeur #116*)



According to Bina great Leaders (and she uses Dr Martin Luther King Jr, Sir Winston Churchill, Nelson Mandela and others as examples) are not necessarily born with the skills, so that means training, life experience and the ability to continue to learn

are all needed to create a great Leader. Nothing we don't already know but it reinforces our need to continue to attend District/Region/Branch training events no matter how long we have been in the Movement. It's called 'snack learning', bits and pieces along the road that support and sustain.

She goes on to explain that effective Leaders have a passion, they don't just do the job or task for the 'position' they do it because of a strong belief and a focus on getting the job done. Great Leaders spend time reflecting on problems of the past, identifying areas where management practices can alter outcomes. Interestingly great Leaders tend to have been involved heavily in some community program or charity. It appears a commitment to community programs curb the need for power and improves the Leader's ability to empathise with others.



So what do we, as Cub Scout Leaders, take from the great Leaders of the world? This is my interpretation of what I need to do to be the best Cub Scout Leader that I can be:

- Continue learning and attend District/Region/Branch/National training activities
- Explore all types of leadership skills and seek support from Leaders around me

- Share my success and issues with others including mentors, peers and colleagues
- Enjoy what I do
- Keep my belief in the Scouting Principles and building healthy communities through Scouting
- Provide strong programs for our Cub Scouts that include all elements of development – social, physical, intellectual, emotional and spiritual
- Encourage our Cub Scouts/Leaders to continue to keep practicing the things they learn
- Review programs/events/activities to see how could they be managed better for even more successful outcomes

Keep my contact with the communities that I am supporting – attend as many Cub Scout events as possible to keep my energy and passion high

Cub Scout Leadership Course

Over the last few months I have had many questions regarding who can run a Cub Scout Leadership Course. I'd like to address this here to help clarify some confusion. The quote below comes from the 'Introduction' in the Cub Scout Leadership Course.

This manual has been designed to assist Leaders to run a Leadership Course for Sixers and Seconds. It has been designed so that Leaders can determine how they wish to run the course. It may be run by an individual Pack or if numbers are low then Packs may combine. It may also be run on a District or Region level.

That said the essence of the Course is for the Youth Members to get as much as possible from the course, to learn about different types of leadership skills, management and behaviours. So the more the merrier so to speak.

A District/Region coordinated course allows for bigger interactions with a larger variety of leadership types, there is also greater opportunities for Leaders to network and share and build on their own skills. It is therefore desirable that this is the way the course is managed but there are many reasons why that is not practicable

Which Badge goes where?

I'm sure that we've all had some exposure to the difficulty of fitting badges onto the coloured sleeve and yoke of the Scout uniform. On the left sleeve there is insufficient room to fit all of the target badges. The image of the left sleeve to the right shows the correct layout of badges.

As a Scout moves up through the award scheme the Camp-craft and elective targets from each level are worn at the front and rear of the sleeve respectively. At the center of the bottom row, under the target award badge, the highest level of Citizenship is worn. The ASM badge is worn between the Patrol emblem and the target award. If the Scout earned the Grey Wolf in Cubs then they can continue to wear it in place of the ASM until such time as the ASM is awarded.

The Scout Craft is worn above the sleeve. Only the top and bottom edges are sewn to the uniform so that this badge forms an epaulette for the cords to be worn under. Cords are not to be worn around the neck. While on the topic of the Scout Craft badge and following on from last month's discussion about linking, this badge should be earned by a Cub progressing to the Scout section as part of the linking process. It bolsters the new Scouts feeling of achievement and belonging to be awarded this badge upon advancement. It also equips them with a few basic skills so that they can readily be of assistance to their new Patrol rather than feeling lost and out of place.

SCOUT LEFT SLEEVE



SSS

Thanks to all the Patrol Leaders who have submitted their expressions of Interest for SSS and also the Leaders for some subtle or not so subtle encouragement. Compared to this time last year there is around a 1000% increase. This years SSS will have a backwoods theme. Backwoods is all about living outdoors with a minimum of conveniences and utensils. It's not about roughing it because any fool can be uncomfortable; it's about using your wits and ingenuity to make life comfortable. A few ideas to help get the creative juices started:

Egg in an Orange

Cut an orange in half. Scoop out the flesh inside and eat it – be careful not to cut through the skin! Now crack an egg into the skin and place on the embers of the fire until the egg is cooked.

Spud Egg / Egg in a potato

Cut the top off a potato of and scoop a hole in the middle. Crack the egg into the hole; put the top back in place and secure with small wooden pegs. Bake until the potato is cooked.

Backwoods Mince

You can cook mince meat inside all sorts of vegetable containers: orange peels, hollowed-out potatoes, onions, gem squash, butternut, or even cabbage leaves.

Kebab

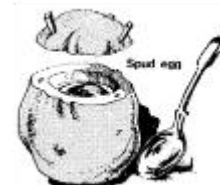
Use a green stick to spear slices of bacon, mushrooms, sausage, carrot, tomato, peppers, and pieces of pork. Support the skewer over glowing embers turning occasionally. Eat when the meat is crisp and golden brown.

Cabbage hot dogs

Lay sliced onion on a cabbage leaf, add a sausage or two and place more onions on top. Wrap up the cabbage leaf tightly and secure with a number of small green sticks. Place in embers for about 7 to 10 minutes, turning occasionally.

Banana hot dogs

Take a banana and cut a slit in the peel down the inside of the curve, and open it outwards. Remove the banana and feed it to a passing monkey or a nearby Scout. Now put a sausage inside the banana peel and cook it directly on the coals.

ROVENTURE

Over the weekend of 26 and 27 March, a committee of the Queensland Branch Rover Executive ran Roventure for Rovers and Venturer Scouts in south-east Queensland. I had the opportunity to visit the event and was pleased to see about ninety Venturer Scouts and twenty-five to thirty Rovers and Leaders in attendance.



While I was there I saw Venturer Scouts taking part in the activities organised and being run by the Rovers. These included a pretty impressive low ropes course with a seatbelt tight (?) rope among other challenges; rides in a Banana Bash car; raft building and launching on the dam; a crazy ladder challenge. Other activities that were available included a water slide; a *pimp my car* activity; horizontal bungee; and aerial sock wrestling. As I was leaving, the sweet sounds of a live band tuning up were assaulting my ear drums. With bogans all around me it looked like it was going to be a wild time in the marquee later that night.

A big thanks to the Rover section for putting on this event, and the other Roventures I notice that are scheduled around the state.

LINKING

Staying with Roventure a bit longer, the purpose of this event and others like it is to assist Venturer Scouts to relate to the next section i.e. Rovers. The badge we have for someone who has completed a series of *getting to know you* activities with the next section is the Link Badge. The design of the badge shows links of a chain which suggests to me that both ends of each link need to be equally strong and equally involved. The concept is that the junior section and the senior section in the relationship are two ends of the same non-directional link in a chain.

I've heard Venturer Scout Leaders protest that Scout Leaders "hang on" to Scouts when they should be advancing to Venturer Scouts. I would not be at all surprised that the Rover section sees the same behaviour with some Venturer Scout Leaders. However, we as Leaders in the Venturer Scout section need to do more than notice and moan, we need to understand what our role is and act accordingly.

In practical terms, it means that Venturer Scout Leaders need to be maintaining contacts with all the Scout troops that could and should be the source of new Venturer Scouts, but equally Venturer Scout Leaders need to be maintaining contact with at least one if not a couple of Rover Crews that could realistically be the next destination for the Venturer Scouts.

This should be happening at Leaders' for a such as Group Councils and District Training Meetings, but if not there then Venturer Scout Leaders need to be looking for other ways of keeping those lines of

communication open.

Unit Councils also have a role in managing this matter and should be vitally concerned that every local Scout advances to Venturer Scouts. This goal then leads to a determination of the strategies the Unit Council can put in place to ensure the Scouts know about, like, and look forward to when they can advance to Venturer Scouts. Similarly, the Unit Council needs to work with local Rover Crews to make sure that every Venturer Scout in the Unit advances to Rovers when the time is right for that Venturer Scout.

Is your Unit doing enough with all the local Scout Troops, especially those without a Venturer Scout Unit in the Group? Is your Unit doing enough with the local Rover Crews? Do the statistics about how many Scouts advance to Venturer Scouts and Venturer Scouts to Rover show that enough is being done?

The following article is excerpts from Sean Eickenloff's diary on his SISEP experience during Dec 2010 to the UK.

Week One – Sunday 28th November 2010 to Saturday 4th December 2010

Madeleine, Rebecca, Shelly and I are finally leaving Brisbane to go to Sydney. After arriving at Sydney Airport, we went on a bus to the international airport. Once we arrived there, we had lunch and looked around the airport. We met up with the other group of Venturer Scouts travelling with us to London. It was time to get on the plane for a long 23 hours of travelling. Once we were on the plane, I started watching movies. We had a quick stop over in Singapore to refuel, than we were on our way to London.



When I arrived in London, I met up with the UK leader and she took me to the train station. After four hours of travelling on the train, I arrived in Plymouth. My host mum Julia was waiting for me and she took me to Central Park to walk their dog Buster. When we arrived home, I met Guy who was my host Explorer (Venturer) and his brother Max. Max is 13 years old, in third year at secondary school and attends scouts.



The next day, I had my first day at City College Plymouth and it was nothing like my school at home. After my day at college we had dinner and went to play tennis. On Thursday, Guy and I went into town and had a look around. On Friday night, I met my host dad Lee and the older brother Huw. Lee is a Commander in the Royal Navy and works in Bristol about 180 kilometres away from the family home. He returns on weekends to the family home.

We then went to a Christingle Service for the 27th Plymouth Scout Group. On Saturday, I went to a table top sale which was being held by the group. The money raised from the sale is going to help the Explorers (Venturers) to go to the World Jamboree in Sweden next year.

Week Two – Sunday 5th December 2010 to Saturday 11th December 2010

On Sunday, I went to the movies to see 'Harry Potter' with the whole family. We put up the Christmas tree today. Sunday night, I went to Explorers and we made Christmas stocking, which was fun.

Julia, my host mum arranged with the college for me to attend cooking courses from this week. On Tuesday, I started cooking

and I learnt how to make Chicken Pate. On Wednesday, I learnt how to make Mushroom Cannelloni. Thursday night, the scouts went collecting money from people, this is to help local charity groups.

On Saturday, we walked the dog and went to Saltram House in Plymouth. Saltram House is a George II era mansion and is one of Britain's best preserved examples of an early Georgian House. We went on a tour of the house to see what it was like back in those days, very different to now.

Week Three – Sunday 12th December 2010 to Saturday 18th December 2010

Sunday, we went to bag pack at Sainsburys Marsh Mills for the scouts. Bag pack is when scouts help out at the local shop packing bags. We raised approximately 1,500 pound for the scout group. On Monday, I went bowling with the group from college. Tuesday, I went to cooking school and I made more Chicken Pate. I learnt how to debone meat and clean it up, at cooking school on Wednesday. I also learnt how to use the vac pack, we rolled chicken in bacon and placed it in the vac pack. Friday was the last day for college until Tuesday 4th January 2011. I went ice skating with Max, Guy and the Scouts on Friday night. It was great fun.

Week Four – Sunday 19th December 2010 to Saturday 25th December 2010

On Sunday, the Explorers (Venturers) went to help out at the Beavers (Joeys) Christmas party. We dressed up as elves and went on a train ride. Afterwards we went to Tesco (like Woolworths or Coles) to do our shopping for a two day camp.

We arrived at the camp to find the road was snowed in and we had to take all our stuff up the big hill by foot. We were going to go caving, but due to the weather conditions and the road full of snow we could not get to the caves. We had a big dinner and then we played games. On Monday, we went to a church and went on a tour. We looked into the life of a Monk and what they did in their everyday life. This was very interesting.



Tuesday, I went into town to buy gifts for the family. Friday, I was cleaning the snow around the house and getting ready for the family Christmas party. Saturday, Christmas day we woke up to Christmas presents under the tree. I received cook books, money and chocolates from my host family. The rest of the family arrived and we played 'Kinect' on the X Box and 'Just Dance' on the Wii. After the family left, we watched 'Doctor Who'. It was not snowing on Christmas day, but there was still snow on the ground from early on in the week.

What is Agoonoree?

The word Agoonoree is used in scouting terminology to describe a camp for young people with special needs. The concept for Queensland's Agoonoree originated in Japan in 1979 when three Queensland Scouts attended the 3rd Nippon Agoonoree. Versions of Agoonoree have been held worldwide as early as 1949. Queensland has been holding Agoonorees since 1980.

Each year Scouts Queensland, in conjunction with Guides Queensland, invites approximately 70 children as our 'guests' to participate in a week-long camp at Baden-Powell Park, Samford. Our guests generally have a disability of some kind, ranging in degrees of severity, or are disadvantaged and do not have the opportunity to go to regular Scout meetings or participate in camping or similar Scout Activities.

The camp is open to Scouts, 12 years of age by 17 September 2011 and above, Venturer Scouts, Rovers and Leaders. Leaders can come from any section of the Movement. Scouts and Venturer Scouts will need to discuss their attendance at this camp with their Leader prior to submitting the Expression of Interest form. 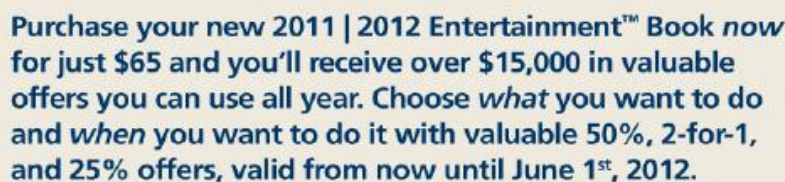
