FUNCTIONS	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. To advise the Chief Commissioner on matters affecting the Rover Scout Section in the Queensland Branch.2. To advise and support the Queensland Branch Rover Council and its activities.3. To support and mentor the Queensland Branch Rover Council Chairman and other senior Rovers.4. To provide leadership and motivation to the Rover Scout Section in Queensland Branch.5. To ensure the development of the Rover Scout Section in the Queensland Branch.6. To carry out functions delegated by, and in support of, the Chief Commissioner representing the best interests of the Branch.7. To ensure that the activities of the Rover Scout Section are conducted in accordance with the National Policy & Rules and the Queensland Branch Scouting Instructions (QBSI).
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DUTIES <i>in conjunction with the Queensland Branch Rover Council and its Chairman</i>	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. To remain up to date on matters relating to the Rover Scout Section at Group, District, Region and at Branch level, with particular regard to the obtaining of the educational
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- objectives of the Rover Scout Section and to keep the Chief Commissioner advised on the same.
2. To remain current with all aspects of the life issues and aspirations of young adults aged 18 – 26 years in the Scout Movement and overseas and the community in general.
 3. To provide enthusiastic, energetic leadership to the Rover Scout Section throughout the Branch, encouraging and facilitating the development of young adults.
 4. To encourage Rover Advisers, Rover Councils and Region representatives to implement active, adventurous programs which centre on the sectional objectives while providing opportunities for personal growth (physical, emotional, social intellectual and spiritual development) of all members of the Rover Scout Section.
 5. To encourage Rover Advisers, Rover Councils and Region representatives to embrace the Scout Method through doing, both directly and in conjunction with the members of their individual teams.
 6. To act as adviser to QBRC activity subcommittees.
 7. To advise District, Region and Branch Commissioners, Rover Advisers and Councils on Rover Scout Section matters.
 8. Ensure appropriate supervision for safe conduct and delivery of the Program and activities.
 9. Ensure that adequate and correct records are kept in relation to finance and equipment in accordance with QBSI.
 10. Promote and encourage Rover, Crew Leader and Adult Leader Training within the Rover Scouts Section.
 11. Ensure high standards of behaviour through personal example and encouragement at all times.
 12. Represent the Chief Commissioner as required.
 13. Attend meetings of Branch Council.
 14. Attend the Youth Program Team meetings, QBRC, QBRC subcommittees, NRC and National Youth Program meetings as appropriate.
 15. Attend Branch, Region and District Commissioner Conferences as required, to discuss and advice on matters affecting the Rover Scout Section.
 16. Any other duties requested by and in support of the Chief Commissioner.

Note: In line with the WOSM Youth Empowerment Policy and the outcomes of the Scouts Australia Rover Section Review, the previous terminology of Branch Commissioner (Rover Scouts) has now been replaced with this new title.
