PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

- To promote specifically the following Rover Scout Section development aspects:
 - 1) Youth Membership recruitment and retention;
 - 2) Youth Program effectiveness, relevance and acceptability;
 - 3) Self-management including adequate and correct record keeping in relation to Finance and equipment and regular reporting
- To encourage Rover Advisers, Rover Councils and Region Representative to implement an active, adventurous, fun

and inclusive Youth program that highlights and centres on youth activity.

- Act as an adviser on Rover Scout Section matters to the
 - Chief Commissioner
 - Deputy Chief Commissioner Youth Program
 - QBRC,
 - QBRC sub committees
 - District, Region and Branch Commissioners,
 - Rover Advisers
 - To support and mentor the QBRC chair-person and other senior Rover Scouts
 - To ensure that the activities of the Rover Scout Section are conducted in accordance the National Policy and Rules and the Queensland Branch Scouting Instructions (QBSI)
 - To keep up to date with all aspects of life affecting young people of Rover Scout age in the Scout Movement both in Australia and overseas and the community in general
 - To provide enthusiastic, energetic leadership to the Rover Scout Section throughout the Branch, encouraging and facilitating the development of young adults.
 - To attend Meetings which include but are not limited to
 - Monthly Youth Program Team meetings
 - Queensland Branch Rover Council and its Sub Committees
 - Region Commissioners' Conferences as required
 - As representative at National Meetings as required
 - Other meetings/Workshop/Conferences etc as requested
 - Promote and encourage Rovers to undertake the appropriate Leader Training
 - To perform any other duties requested by and in support of the Deputy Chief Commissioner Youth Program.
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CRITERIA

- A personal commitment to the Purpose and Principles of Scouts Australia, and an ability to convey a positive and constructive image of Scouting and reinforce the fundamental importance of the Scout Promise and Law.
- Be enthusiastic and able to motivate, build, lead, and chair teams involving both youth and adults.
- Be inclusive in leadership style.
- Be able to communicate effectively with all levels in Scouting.



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- Have a sound understanding of the use of technology, information systems, communications and video conferencing to achieve the outcomes of the role.
 - Be able to mediate, carry out reviews, write reports, and make recommendations.
 - Proven ability to prioritise workloads and multitask to ensure commitments are fulfilled in a timely manner.

ROLE SPECIFIC CRITERIA

- Hold a Program Support Leader (Leader of Adults) wood badge or be prepared to complete Program Support Leader training within 12 months of appointment.
 - Have a good understanding of the Youth Program
 - Have a demonstrated ability to work effectively with Adults Members
 - Have a demonstrated ability to work effectively with Youth members of the Rover Scout Section
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
