




Hendrix the Hatchling

Hendrix and Tiddilek started swimming. They zipped through a school of angelfish. "What beautiful, nice creatures," Hendrix thought.


As Hendrix admired the angelfish, he realised he was being pulled in a different direction.

The two turtles stopped screaming.


"You're not going to eat us?" asked Hendrix.
